

1. Acceptance of the minutes of the March 12, 2018 City Council meeting.

COMMUNICATIONS:

4. From the Chief of the Police Department requesting authorization to expend a donation in the amount of \$2,090.00 from the Campello Association. (the Police Department intends to use the funds to purchase a ballistic shield for usage by the Special Reaction Team).
5. From the Mayor in accordance with M.G. L., Ch. 44, recommending that the City Council authorize the acceptance and expenditure of the total donation in the amount of \$2,090 from Campello Business Association to City of Brockton-Police Department-SRT Unit. (the Police Department intends to use the funds to purchase a ballistic shield for usage by the Special Reaction Team).
6. From the CFO in accordance with Section 5 of Ch. 324 of the Acts of 1990, certifying the proposed donation in the amount of \$2,090 from Campello Business Association to City of Brockton-Police Department-SRT Unit.
7. From the Chief Budget Officer of Brockton School Department requesting that the City Council amend the current capital spending limit from the \$10,000 threshold as outlined in the ordinances of the City of Brockton to be increased to \$25,000. As known, the capital spending limit for all city departments is \$10,000 and has been at this limit since 1993. In order for the school Department to continue to replace ageing police cars and maintenance trucks, we need to increase the sufficient amount that would allow us to purchase used vehicles that still have many years of useful life.
8. From the Mayor in Accordance with M.G.L., Ch. 44, recommending that the City Council adopt the Ordinance to amend part II, Section 2-297, Article IV, Financial Affairs of the Revised Ordinances of the City of Brockton.
9. From the CFO in accordance with Section 5 of Ch. 324 of the Acts of 1990, certifying the proposed Ordinance relative to Section 2-297, Capital Improvement defined without a detrimental impact on the continuous provision of the existing level of municipal services.

17. Ordered: The City Auditor shall cause to be published on the city's website in PDF or other form of attachment, a list of vendor payments and other related payments processed by the Auditor's Department which are public records. (FAVORABLE)
18. Ordered: that the sum of \$150,000 is appropriated to pay costs of replacing the City Hall elevator, and for the payment of all other costs incidental and related thereto, and that to meet this appropriation, the City Treasurer, with the approval of the Mayor, is authorized to borrow said amount under and pursuant to M.G.L. c. 44, ss7(1), or pursuant to any other enabling authority, and to issue bonds or notes of the City therefor. The funds appropriated by this order shall be expended in addition to the \$335,000 previously appropriated for this project pursuant to a loan order of this Council adopted on February 12, 2018, and approved by the Mayor on February 13, 2018. Such bonds or notes shall be general obligations of the City, and the Mayor is authorized to expend all funds available for the project and to take any other action necessary to carry out this project . Any premium received upon the sale of any bonds or notes approved by this order, less any such premium applied to the payment of the costs of issuance of such bonds or notes, may be applied to the payment of costs approved by this order in accordance with M.G.L. c. 44, ss20, thereby reducing the amount authorized to be borrowed to pay such costs by a like amount. Further Ordered: That the City Treasurer is authorized to file an application with The Commonwealth of Massachusetts' Municipal Finance Oversight Board to qualify under Chapter 44A of the General Laws any and all bonds or notes of the City authorized by this vote, and to provide such information and execute such documents as the Municipal Finance Oversight Board of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts may require. (FAVORABLE)
19. Ordered: That Order 413 of this Council, approved on August 22, 2016, is amended to reduce the total amount authorized to be borrowed pursuant to this order. (FAVORABLE)

25. An Ordinance Amending Part II of the Revised Ordinances of the City of Brockton. Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Brockton as follows Article IV, Financial Affairs, of Division 4, Chief Financial Officer, of the Revised Ordinances of the City of Brockton is hereby amended.
26. An Ordinance Amending Chapter 27 of the revised Ordinance of the City Of Brockton Concerning The Humanitarian Medical Use Of Marijuana. Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Brockton. Article III. General Regulations and Permitted Modifications, Section 27-24.3 Humanitarian medical use of marijuana.
27. An Ordinance Amending Chapter 27 of the Revised Ordinance of the City of Brockton concerning the regulations and taxation of Marijuana be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Brockton. Article III. General Regulations and Permitted Modifications, is hereby amended by adding the following Section 27-24.4 Adult use of marijuana.

Order: Acceptance of M.G.L Chapter 64N, Section 3 Local Otion Tax Of Marijuana Products be it ordered by the City Council of the City of Brockton to accept the provisions of Section 3 of Chapter 64N of the General Laws, empowering the City of Brockton to implement a three (3%) tax upon the sale or transfer of marijuana or marijuana products by a marijuana retailer operating within the City of Brockton.
