The GSC is charged with exploring, by whatever means it deems appropriate, all aspects of local government organization and structure, the strengths and weaknesses in Brockton's current form of government and areas for improvement, alternative models of government, and recommend changes in such organization and structure, including, but not limited to, the terms of office, and the method of selection of officials, consistent with the needs of the City, and designed to achieve greater efficiency and effectiveness in the delivery of government services. POSTPONED INDEFINITELY FOR NOW ON MARCH 2, 2015.
- 12. RESOLVE: that a representative of Stonehill College be invited to appear before a Committee of this Council to review the relationship of between the City and the College relative to provision of City services.

- 14. RESOLVE: that the Mayor, City Solicitor, and the Chief Financial Officer be invited to appear before a Committee of this Council to review the legal and financial implications of the City's contract with Aquaria.
