

Legal Notice

CITY OF BROCKTON SEAL

At its meeting of November 3, 2015,
the Brockton Board of Health voted
(unanimously) to fluoridate the
City water supply to an optimum level of 7 parts per million (ppm).

If any organization, private entity, social entity, individual or
group of individuals obtain a petition consisting of ten percent (10%) of
the City's registered voters and if filed with the City Clerk within ninety (90) days
of this publication, the following question shall be placed on the official ballot
at the next regular City election or a biennial State election, whichever occurs first,
but no earlier than sixty (60) days following the date of filing the petition with the
City Clerk.

“Shall the public water supply for domestic use in the City of Brockton
be fluoridated?”

If a majority of votes are in the negative, the water supply shall not be fluoridated,
and the fluoridation of such water supply shall not be ordered again by the Board of Health
for a period of at least two (2) years from the date of such vote.
