



Brockton Public Schools shall develop a policy to ensure that as many eligible students as possible have the opportunity to vote on Election Day.

D. The Brockton Area Transit Authority, hereinafter referred to as BAT, shall provide registration materials to individuals purchasing parking permits and Smart Cards on site. BAT shall deliver any completed voter registration forms to the city's Elections Commission.

Be it Ordained by the City Council of the City of Brockton as follows:

Section (1) Purpose and Intent.

The ability for all citizens to participate in elections is a fundamental civil right and a central principle of our democracy. Massachusetts currently has a voter registration cutoff law that requires voters to register at least 20 days prior to participating in an election. Restrictions on registration disenfranchise voters and have a disproportionate impact on low-income and minority residents. The City of Brockton deems it necessary and beneficial to the City and its residents to increase access to voter registration during routine interactions with city officials, employees, and departments.

Section (2) Availability of Voter Registration Forms

All applicable City Departments and employees shall ensure that the following is enforced to allow residents of Brockton easy access to voter registration forms:

- A. The Brockton Public Library shall make voter registration forms available in conspicuous locations at all branch libraries. Voter registration forms shall be offered to individuals when applying for library cards.
- B. Youth and family centers and other institution, including but not limited to the Brockton Housing Authority and educational institutions which partner with and/or receive under from the City of Brockton shall make vote registration forms available at conspicuous locations.
- C. All Brockton Public High Schools and Brockton Public Schools Welcome Centers shall provide pre-registration information and forms to all students eligible to pre-register. Voter registration forms shall also be provided to parents or legal guardians when registering children for school. Brockton Public Schools shall ensure as many eligible students as possible have the opportunity to vote on Election Day. Notwithstanding the aforementioned, there shall be the reestablishment of having designated Brockton High School employees appointed by and sworn-in by the Brockton City Clerk as volunteer voter registrars within the confines of Brockton High School in order to help foster registering any eligible student.
- D. The Brockton Area Transit Authority shall provide registration materials to individuals purchasing parking permits and Smart Cards on site.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ARTICLE V. DEPARTMENTS, DIVISION 7. DEPARTMENT OF PERSONNEL

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Brockton as follows:

The title of the Ordinance, <u>Department of Personnel</u>, shall be replaced with <u>Department of Human Resources</u>.

SECTION 2-379. - Established. is hereby amended as follows:

There is hereby established a Department of Human Resources.

<u>SECTION 2-380. – Director.</u> is hereby amended as follows:

There shall be a <u>Human Resources Director</u> who shall be appointed by the mayor, for a term of three (3) years, subject to confirmation by the City Council. The Director shall appoint such other technical and clerical employees as deemed necessary to carry out the functions of the department.

<u>SECTION 2-381. – Duties.</u> is hereby amended as follows:

The Human Resources Director shall:

- Manage and participate in the development and provision of all human resource services including recruitment, compensation, classification, benefits, training, and policy administration and implementation;
- 2. Establish uniform human resources policies and ensures that the City complies with all local, state and federal human resource laws, rules and regulations including ADA, civil rights and FLSA;
- 3. Manage the recruitment and selection process for all positions, working with appointing authorities, to ensure outreach, equal opportunity, and compliance with federal and state laws;
- 4. Manage the Civil Service process working with appointing authorities and serve as liaison to the Massachusetts Human Resources Division;
- 5. Propose and maintain a uniform classification system for municipal positions;
- 6. Maintain individual personnel records of all City employees. Said records shall contain all the vital statistics and other pertinent data for each and every person employed by the City. It shall be the duty of each City officer and employee to furnish to the Human Resources Director such records and reports as the Director may require;
- 7. Provide advice and assistance to the Mayor, department heads, supervisors and elected and appointed officials on all human resources matters, including benefits, position classifications, pay administration, recruitment and placement, employee relations, performance evaluation, disciplinary action, workers' compensation, employee grievances and employee training;
- 8. Standardize forms and records to be used in the City's personnel administration program other than those forms and records whose format is regulated by statute or by state agency;
- 9. Develop health plans and safety programs for employees as required by, and in accordance with, state and federal laws; and
- 10. Have such other powers and duties as the Mayor and the City Council shall direct in a detailed position description recommended by the Mayor and approved by the City Council.

SECTION 2-381A. Requirements. shall be deleted in its entirety.

This Ordinance shall be effective upon passage.
