Ordered: That the sum of \$2,000,000 is appropriated to pay costs of developing a parking garage, and for making street and traffic improvements within the Development District approved by the City and being undertaken in conjunction with Trinity Financial, and that to meet this appropriation, the Treasurer, with the approval of the Mayor, is authorized to borrow said amount under and pursuant to M.G.L. c. 40Q (the District Improvement Financing statute), M.G.L. c. 44 and/or any other enabling authority, and to issue bonds or notes of the City therefor; that such bonds or notes shall be general obligations of the City, although such bonds or notes shall be payable in the first instance from property tax revenue expected to be derived from new development within the Development District. The amount authorized to be borrowed pursuant to this order shall be expended in addition to all amounts received by the City from The Commonwealth of Massachusetts and from Trinity Financial to pay costs of the project.

Ordered: That the City Treasurer is authorized to file an application with The Commonwealth of Massachusetts' Municipal Finance Oversight Board to qualify under Chapter 44A of the General Laws any and all bonds or notes of the City authorized by this vote, and to provide such information and execute such documents as the Municipal Finance Oversight Board of The Commonwealth of Massachusetts may require.

Further Ordered: Pursuant to the Downtown Urban Renewal Plan adopted by the City Council in 2016, The Brockton redevelopment authority, acting by and through its executive director, shall approve all plans, all expenditures of the public funds, and shall maintain all records related to the construction of the parking garage project, the authority shall ensure compliance with all applicable state and federal laws relating to public construction projects.
