This award will also fund Old Colony YMCA street outreach and case management services, mentoring from Choices4Teens and Brockton Christian Mentoring Initiative, a summer jobs program run by MassHire Youth Works, a high school equivalency exam preparation program through Massasoit Community College, Graffiti removal conducted by Father Bills/Mainspring Coalition/Work Express, and fiscal management. The match consists of in-kind services only.
