






Section 1.009 (b) (2) of the licensing and business regulations is

section:


“Notwithstanding any other requirement, no transfer of a license shall

the date of request to transfer said license.”





AN ORDINANCE AMENDING REVISED ORDINANCE OF THE
CITY OF BROCKTON, CHAPTER 6, ARTICLE 1, SECTION 6-2
COMPOSITION


That Chapter 6, Article 1, Section 6-2 of the Revised Ordinances of
the City of Brockton be amended to increase the number of Fire Department
Captains by one (1), from seventeen (17) to eighteen (18), for a limited
period of time, subject to a sunset clause, as set forth below:

Section 6-2(b) Eighteen Captains.


The increase in the number of Captains in the Fire Department shall
be for a limited time only. The additional position of an Eighteenth(18th)
Captain, as set forth in this Amendment, shall be eliminated and the number
of captains allowed in the Fire Department shall revert back to seventeen
(17) immediately upon a vacancy occurring in said title for any reason,
including but not limited to, the termination, resignation, retirement,
promotion, or any other separation from employment by any one (1) of the
eighteen (18) captains of the Fire Department.





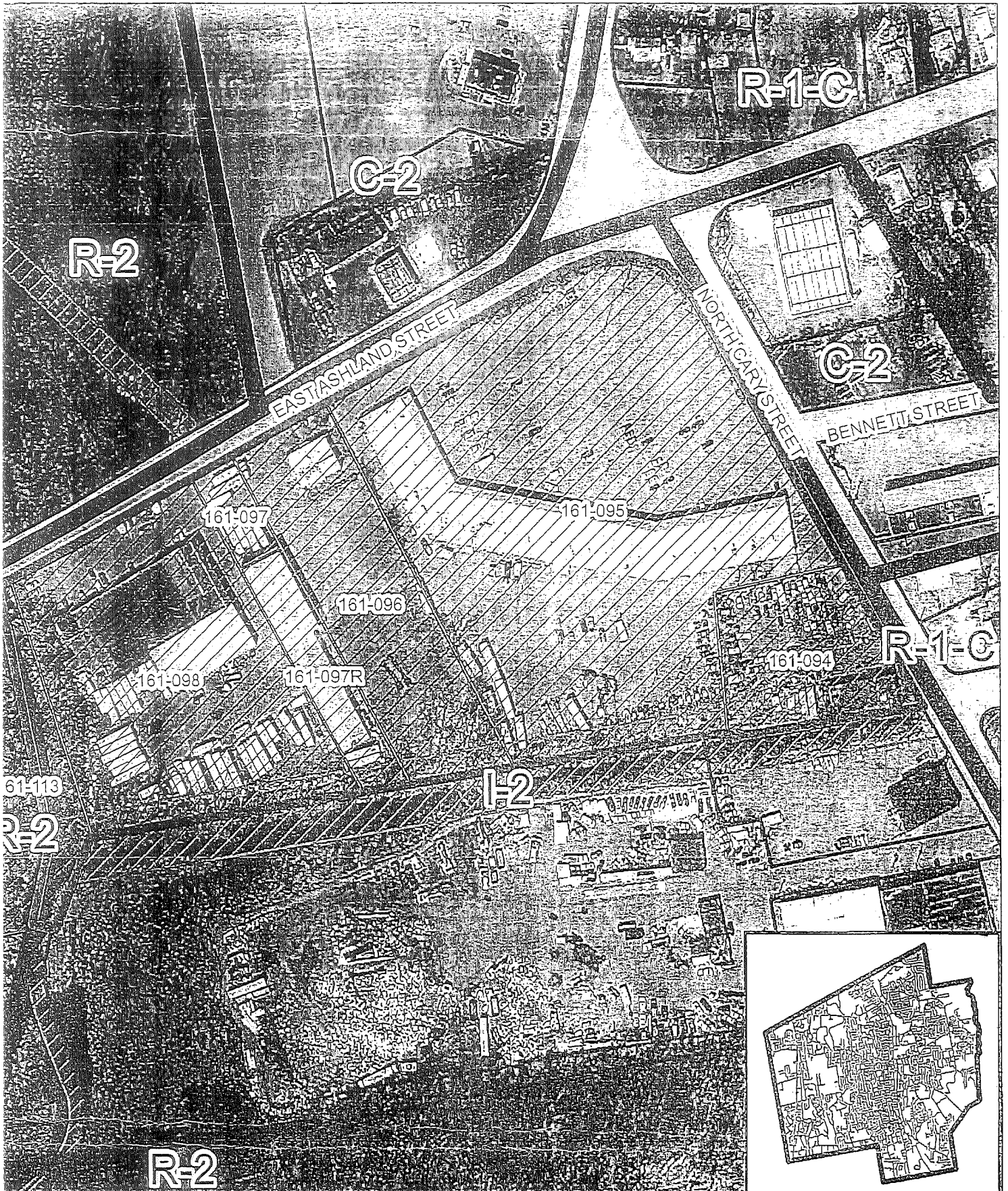

E Ashland St Zoning Recommendation

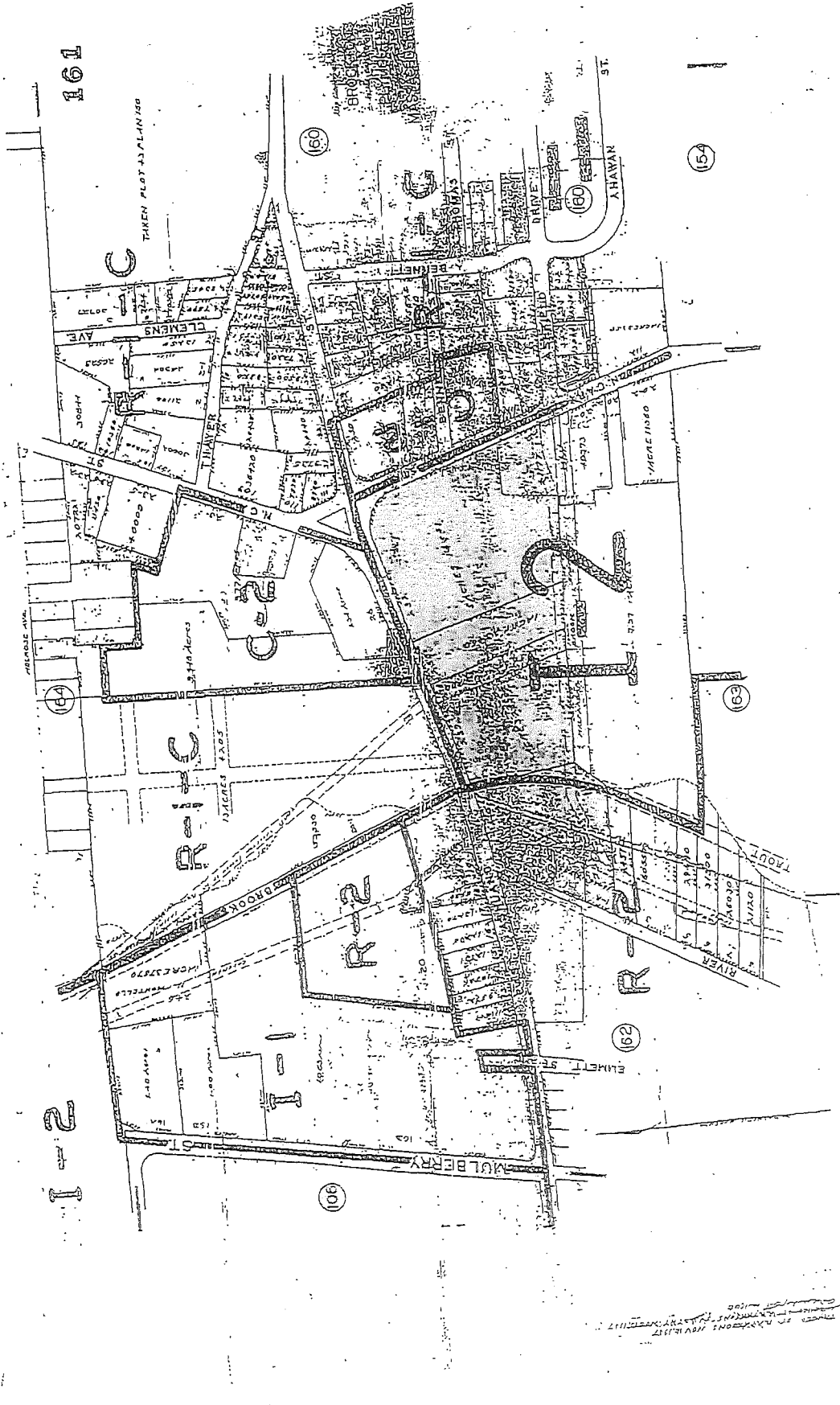


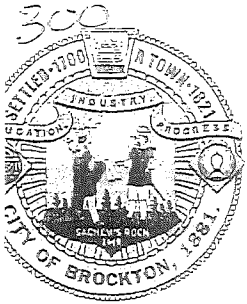


RE: The City of Brockton, Massachusetts Zoning District Map dated November 10, 1967, and thereafter amended, that said map be amended to reflect the following zoning change: Parcel ID 161-095, 235 E. Ashland Street I-2 (current) to C-2 Zone.

Dear Mr. Zeoli:

The Planning Board held a public hearing on April 2, 2019 regarding the above entitled change. The Board had a concern that changing zoning for one individual property owner/parcel and/or property could appear as "spot zoning" or "contract zoning".

After discussion, the Board voted unanimously to recommend the change favorably with the following proposed amendment; that the following additional parcels be included in the proposed change **161-094, 161-096, 161-097, 161-097R, 161-098, and 161-113**, as shown on the attached map.
