RESOLVE:

Resolution to Discuss the Current City Curfew and its Effects on the City's Restaurants

WHEREAS, on Saturday August 22nd the Mayor of City of Brockton ordered a curfew for all residents and visitors between the hours of 11 p.m. to 5 a.m. with exceptions for essential travel to address the City's designation at that time as a "higher risk" community for COVID-19 infection; and

WHEREAS, in compliance with the Mayor's ordered curfew Brockton's restaurants have closed their operations at 11 p.m.; and

WHEREAS, the City of Brockton since August 20th has been in the moderate risk designation for COVID-19 infection; and

WHEREAS, the City of Brockton's restaurants have been greatly impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic and curfew and are under threat to close their operations permanently; and

WHEREAS, the City of Brockton should consider amending the current curfew and allow Brockton's restaurants to operate later daily or in the alternative to operate later Thursday's, Friday's, and Saturday's; and

NOW THEREFORE, be it RESOLVED as follows:

- 1) That the City of Brockton should consider amending the current curfew and allow Brockton's restaurants to operate later daily or in the alternative to operate later Thursday's, Friday's, and Saturday's
