7. From the Chief of the Fire Department requesting that the City Council authorize the acceptance and expenditure of the total grant award in the form of PPE, hand sanitizer, and disinfectant wipes from Ocean State Job Lot to the City of Brockton Fire Department and City of Brockton Police Department worth \$12,000.00. There is no required match for these funds.
8. From the Mayor in accordance with M.G.L., Ch. 44, recommending that the City Council authorize the acceptance and expenditure of the total grant award in the form of PPE, hand sanitizer, and disinfectant wipes from Ocean State Job Lot to the City of Brockton Fire Department and City of Brockton Police Department. Ocean State Job Lot donated KN95 masks, face shields, hand sanitizer, and disinfecting wipes worth \$12,000.00 to the Brockton Fire Department and Brockton Police Department. There is no required match for these funds.

10. From the Chief of the Fire Department requesting the City Council authorize the acceptance and expenditure of the total grant award in the amount of \$14,599.00 from the Commonwealth of Massachusetts Executive Office of Public Safety; a FY2021 Student Awareness of Fire Education (S.A.F.E.) grant in the amount of \$11,380.00, and an FY2021 Senior SAFE Grant in the amount of \$3,219.00. (The Fire Department intends to use these Grant funds for Brockton's Fire Safety Education Program). There is no required match for these funds.

11. From the Mayor in accordance with M.G.L., Ch. 44, recommending that the City Council authorize the acceptance and expenditure of the total grant award in the amount of \$14,599.00 from the Commonwealth of Massachusetts Executive Office of Public Safety-FY21 Student Awareness of Fire Safety (S.A.F.E.) Grant- \$11,380.00 and Commonwealth of Massachusetts Executive Office of Public Safety-FY21 Senior Awareness of Fire Education (S.A.F.E.) Grant-\$3,219.00 to City of Brockton Fire Department-FY21 Student and Senior Awareness Of Fire Education (S.A.F.E.) Grant Fund (The FY21 Student Awareness of Fire Education (S.A.F.E.) Grant Fund will be used toward the City of Brockton's Fire Safety Education Program). There is no required match for these funds.

From the CFO in accordance with Section 5 of Ch. 324 of the Acts of 1990, certifying support of the total grant in the amount of \$14,599.00 from the Commonwealth of Massachusetts Executive Office of Public Safety-FY21 Student Awareness of Fire Safety (S.A.F.E.) Grant- \$11,380.00 and Commonwealth of Massachusetts Executive Office of Public Safety-FY21 Senior Awareness of Fire Education (S.A.F.E.) Grant-\$3,219.00 to City of Brockton Fire Department-FY21 Student and Senior Awareness Of Fire Education (S.A.F.E.) Grant Fund
13. From the Chief of the Police Department requesting the City Council authorize the acceptance of a donation of an additional 76 Evenflo child passenger safety seats valued at \$4,000.00 through the Buckle Up for Life Gift of Safety Partnership operated by Toyota Motors North America and Cincinnati Children's Hospital. Copeland Toyota of Brockton is purchasing and storing the seats.
14. From the Mayor in accordance with M.G.L., Ch. 44, recommending that the City Council authorize the acceptance and expenditure of the total grant award in the form of 76 additional car seats valued at \$4,000.00 from the Buckle Up for Life Gift of Safety Partnership Grant to the City of Brockton Police Department- Buckle Up for Life Gift of Safety Partnership Grant Fund. The Buckle Up for Life Gift of Safety Partnership is a grant program through the Buckle Up for Life initiative of Toyota Motors North America and Cincinnati Children's Hospital. It partners a local Toyota dealership with a public safety of social services agency to provide car seats to be installed at special events hosted by the dealership. Copeland Toyota will be the Brockton Police Department's partner and will be responsible for the purchase and storage of the additional 76 seats that have been donated through the program.

Ordinance: An Ordinance Amending Part II of the Revised Ordinances, Chapter 21 "Taxicabs, Buses, etc." Be it Ordained by the City Council of the City of Brockton: Section 21-11(a) shall be amended. (IN CITY COUNCIL, FEBRUARY 8, 2021, THE AMENDMENT PASSED BY A ROLL CALL VOTE. PASSED TO A THIRD READING, AS AMENDED, BY A ROLL CALL VOTE)
17. Ordinance: Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Brockton as follows: That the City Council adopt the following Amendment to the Ordinance Establishing Licensing and Regulation for Adult Use Marijuana Establishments: Section 1.004(1)(h) is amended by inserting the following sentence to the end of section 1.004(1)(h): "This section limiting the number of recreational retail marijuana licenses shall not apply to an RMD that was provisionally licensed not later than July 1, 2017." Be it further ordained by the City Council of the City of Brockton as follows: That the language "Intentionally omitted" in Section 1.005 be stricken and the following language be inserted in its place, so that the following language replaces Section 1.005 in its entirety: "Upon such time as the City Council has granted all available recreational retail marijuana licenses pursuant to subsection 1.004(1)(h), the Clerk of the City Council shall no longer accept any new applications for a recreational retail marijuana license. Notice shall be given in writing to any

- applicant with a pending application notifying the applicant that there are no available recreational retail marijuana licenses. If any recreational retail marijuana licenses become available in the City of Brockton, the City Clerk shall post notice of the same on the City website and by posting notice of the same in City Hall.” (IN CITY COUNCIL, FEBRUARY 8, 2021, THE AMENDMENT PASSED BY A ROLL CALL VOTE. PASSED TO A THIRD READING, AS AMENDED, BY A ROLL CALL VOTE)
18. Ordinance: An Ordinance Amending Part II of the Revised Ordinance, Article II City Council, Division 3 Rules or Order and Procedure. Be It Ordained by the City Council of the City of Brockton: Section 2-91 shall be amended by adding the following new section: (f) Committee on equity, diversity and inclusion, to consist of five (5) councilors, to consider matters pertaining to equity, diversity and inclusion in the City of Brockton, and in general, to support City departments that deal with such issues. That the City Council adopt the following Amendment to the Ordinance Establishing Licensing and Regulation for Adult Use Marijuana Establishments: Section 1.007(2)(a) is amended by striking the entire sentence and inserting the following in its place: "Priority application review will be granted to existing Social Equity Participant applicants for retail licenses. Social Equity Program Participant means an individual who qualified to participate in the Social Equity Program and is designated as a program participant by the Cannabis Control Commission. For a period of three (3) years, measured by the date at which a retail license becomes available in the City of Brockton, the City Council shall only review applications for a retail license for Social Equity Participant applicants."

Be it further Resolved that the City Council recommend to the Mayor that the City of Brockton create a fund for the marijuana impact tax fees to create a Recreation and Innovation Center that substantially supports the youth (over 17,000 children) of the City Brockton.
