  - III- Special inquiry from Mr. Jorge Jaysen Alves Goncalves, a City resident: Mr. Goncalves is soliciting a meeting with Board Members to ask about 1-additional tobacco permit for the City, and 2-why there is no license for food trucks. A letter was submitted to the BOH by Mr. Goncalves.
  - I- (Brief overview)→COVID-19 Vaccination Clinics May 22-28 include:
    - 5/22: @ the Shaw's Center, 2<sup>nd</sup> dose clinic (exceeded expectation): 270 total vaccines.
    - 5/22: @ @ Vicente's Mkt. w/ Yankee Line Pfizer, 68
    - 5/24: @ 4 Middle Schools in Brockton w/ the Yankee Line, Pfizer 1st dose, 391 vaccines
    - 5/25: @ BHS + 4 Middle Schools w/ the Yankee Line, 296 doses
    - 5/25: @ ATrenne: 12 vaccines (2<sup>nd</sup> dose)
    - 5/25: @ CV. Assoc.: 57 vaccines (2<sup>nd</sup> doses)
    - 5/26: @ WB Masson, 37 doses (2<sup>nd</sup> doses)
    - 5/26: @ the Campello's High Rise, 18 vaccines
    - 5/27: @ CV. Assoc.: 38 doses; Also:@Roosevelt Heights=11 doses
    - 5/27: BHS, 2<sup>nd</sup> doses clinic: 121 doses (2<sup>nd</sup> doses)
- TOTAL vaccines for this week: 1,319 vaccines...**

- IV- COVID-19 Vaccination remains a substantial initiative of the Board of Health. By June 25, BNHC will no longer open for clinic at the Shaw’s Center, and this will mark the end of the National Guards in vaccination clinic in the City. In the effort to help in keeping the vaccination campaign alive for Brockton residents, BOH will continue working closely with the Mayor’s Office to offer at least a weekly clinic at that location for some time.
  
- V- BOH Van Project: we are moving ahead with the plan. We have received an estimate on the total cost, including the customized features to reflect BOH needs (\$40K...)
  
- VI- BOH 3<sup>rd</sup> Nursing position filled. As of 5/24, BOH filled Nursing vacancy.
  
- VII- FY22 Budget: BOH will meet with Council Committee on FY22. Scheduled date: 6/8, 6:30 PM.
  
- VIII- 5/29-Reopening Massachusetts Gov. Baker moves to rescind COVID-19 protocol! Reopening of Brockton: BOH and the Mayor consider moving a bit slower to fully reopen and get back to normalcy...!
  
- IX- Dashboard on COVID-19: the current statistics on the pandemic show Brockton in a more favorable position. We are currently in the yellow with a daily average of 11 cases per 100,000, and about 3% of positive rate of COVID tests for Brockton.
  
- X- A- Health Promotion & Public Health Education: MDPH has provided tremendous support throughout the pandemic. We continue to partner with various stakeholders around the City: community organization like Cape Verdean Organization, the School Department, Clergy groups, with different media outlets, Brockton Housing Authority, etc.
