1. Ordered: That the naming of North Manchester Street also have the honorary name of “Ruth E. Silva Way” in recognition of Ruth E. Silva, who is a resident of the City of Brockton and has fostered over 250 children on North Manchester Street.

2. Ordered: Acceptance and expenditure of a donation in the amount of \$3,000.00 from Easton Festival of Trees to the City of Brockton Police Department.

3. Ordered: That the City Council authorizes the re-authorization of the Comcast Revolving Fund for FY2022, from all cash receipts from Comcast franchise fees, in excess of \$675,000, pursuant to the cable license contract, and that further, that the expenditure from this fund shall not exceed \$750,000 without further appropriation, during fiscal year 2022.

4. Ordered: That the City Council authorizes the re-authorization of the Demolition Revolving Fund for FY2022 for the sole purpose of helping to fund cost in connection with demolition of buildings in the City of Brockton. The Demolition Revolving Fund shall receive the receipt of payments of all demolition charges of the city of Brockton. Expenditures from the Demolition Revolving Fund shall be made at the direction of the building Superintendent, with the written approval of the Mayor, provided that not more than \$110,000 may be so expended from the Demolition revolving Fund During FY2022. The Building Superintendent shall comply with the reporting requirement of M.G.L., Chapter 44, Section 53E ½.

5. Ordered: That the City Council authorize the re-authorization of the Vacant and Abandoned Buildings Revolving Fund for the purpose of maintaining the Abandoned Building Registry, as well as the closing, boarding up and care of vacant and abandoned buildings. The Vacant and Abandoned Building Revolving Fund shall receive the receipts of payments of fines and fees for the registration of vacant and abandoned buildings. Expenditures from the Vacant and Abandoned Buildings revolving fund shall be made on the authority and direction of the Brockton Building Commissioner, provided that not more than two hundred and fifty thousand (\$250,000) may be so expended without

further appropriation from the Vacant and Abandoned Buildings Revolving Fund during FY22. The Brockton Building Commissioner shall comply with the reporting requirements of M.G.L., Ch. 44, Section 53E ½.
