Mayor Robert F. Sullivan to proclaim June “LGBTQ+ Pride Month” in the City of Brockton

Sullivan to be first-ever Brockton Mayor to raise an LGBTQ+ flag at City Hall

BROCKTON – Mayor Robert F. Sullivan announced that on Tuesday, June 2nd at 11:30 am, the City of Brockton will host the first-ever LGBTQ+ flag-raising event at City Hall.

On April 29th, 2021, a constituent emailed the Mayor’s Office inquiring about the possibility of issuing a proclamation recognizing June as LGBTQ+ Pride Month. The Mayor quickly agreed, and, upon further review, discovered that no other Brockton Mayor has ever officially proclaimed the month of June LGBTQ+ Pride Month or has ever raised an LGBTQ+ flag at City Hall.

In the email, the constituent described the hardships faced by the LGBTQ+ community and explained that a reaffirming gesture from the City of Brockton would be meaningful.

“As Mayor of the City of Brockton, my goal has always been to ensure the safety and security of all residents regardless of gender, race, or sexual orientation,” said Mayor Robert F. Sullivan. “I look forward to recognizing the LGBTQ+ community with this historic event.”
