Persons
 - 6) Support Pregnant or Parenting
Women and Their Families,
Including Babies with
Neonatal Abstinence Syndrome;
and
 - 7.) Prevent Misuse of Opioids
and Implement Prevention
EducationExpenditures from the Opioid
Settlement Revolving fund shall
be made on the authority and
direction of the Mayor of the
City of Brockton, provided not
more than \$250,000 may be
expended from the Opioid

Settlement Revolving Fund during each fiscal year, without the consent of the city council.



The Opioid Settlement Revolving Fund shall be created to support the following programs set by the Commonwealth of Massachusetts:

- 1.) Opioid Use Disorder Treatment
- 2.) Support People In Treatment and Recovery
- 3.) Connections to Care
- 4.) Harm Reduction
- 5.) Address the Needs of Criminal Justice-Involved Persons
- 6.) Support Pregnant or Parenting Women and Their Families, Including Babies with Neonatal Abstinence Syndrome; and
- 7.) Prevent Misuse of Opioids and Implement Prevention Education

Expenditures from the Opioid Settlement Revolving fund shall be made on the authority and direction of the Mayor of the City of Brockton, provided not more than \$250,000 may be expended from the Opioid Settlement Revolving Fund during each fiscal year, without the consent of the city council.



Under Application requirements and procedures, section 2 shall be stricken in its entirety.


