

## CITY OF BROCKTON

1. Ordinance: An Ordinance Prohibiting Camping on Public Property to create an ordinance to prohibit camping on public property and to provide for removal of campsites on public property.

Ordained in City Council January 13<sup>th</sup>, 2025.

2. Ordinance: An Ordinance Prohibiting Loitering in Public Place to prohibit loitering in public places and to establish violations and penalties.

Ordained as amended in City Council January 13<sup>th</sup>, 2025

3. Ordinance: An Ordinance to adopt a new section of the Zoning Ordinance to establish the MBTA Communities Multi-family Overlay District to allow multi-family housing as of right in accordance with Section 3A of the Zoning Act (Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 40A).

Ordained as amended in City Council January 27<sup>th</sup>, 2025.

4. Ordinance: An Ordinance pursuant to Section 27-5 of the City Ordinances "Zoning Map" to amend said map to designate the listed parcels as the MBTA Communities Overlay District.

Ordained in City Council January 27<sup>th</sup>, 2025.

5. Ordinance: An Ordinance amending the City's Zoning Ordinances to regulate and permit accessory dwelling units by right in the R1 district for single-family lots.

Ordained as amended in City Council January 27<sup>th</sup>, 2025.

6. Ordinance: An Ordinance to replace Chapter 11, Article III "Dealers in Secondhand Precious Metals or Gems" and to adopt a revised ordinance for

Dealers in Secondhand Precious Metals or Gems in the City of Brockton relative to regulated property, licenses, inspections, recordkeeping, and regulations.

Ordained as amended in City Council January 27<sup>th</sup>, 2025.

7. Ordinance: An Ordinance to replace Sec. 12-28 "Towing" in its entirety and to adopt a revised ordinance for Towing operations in the City of Brockton relative to the towing list, qualification, requirements and assignments.

Ordained in City Council February 10<sup>th</sup>, 2025.
